**Thursday, July 8**

### **Boys Grades 9 & 10 Emmanuel College – Boston, MA**

#### **Southeast 77, Metro 44**

In a strong team effort, Southeast got even scoring with five players in double figures en route to the win. Shawn Whooley (Weymouth, Weymouth HS), Jahleel Moise (Brockton, Brockton HS), AJ Flanagan (Milton, Milton HS), Aaron Davis (Marshfield, Brooks School) and Sayvonn Houston (Brockton, Brockton HS) each scored between 10 and 13 points. Metro's Kyle Lawyer (Hyde Park, Cathedral HS) managed 15 points in the loss.

#### **Coastal 52, Central 50**

Despite a great effort by Corey Gomes (Uxbridge, Uxbridge HS), Central was on the losing end of a tough battle with Coastal.
